National Reading Panel

Title 1 schools must use teaching resources and methods that have been proven to work based on reliable evidence. The Report of the National Reading Panel

(2000) determined that developing these five skills is essential for reading success:

- Phonemic Awareness- The ability to hear and identify sounds in spoken words
- Phonics The relationship between the letters of written language and the sounds of spoken language
- Fluency The capacity to read accurately, quickly, and with good expression
- Vocabulary The words students must know to

Reading Intervention:

Students are instructed in reading for more than 90 minutes each day in a research-based core reading program. They are taught in whole group and small groups. Students not reaching benchmark goals are also given an additional 30 minutes of small group instruction each day in the classroom setting. The most intensive students are given another 30 minutes of instruction outside the classroom setting daily.
